2018 Lifetime Achievement Honoree

Terrence (Terry) B. Larkin is the Executive Vice President, Business Development, General Counsel and Corporate Secretary of Lear Corporation. Lear Corporation is one of the world's leading suppliers of automotive seating and electrical systems with 257 facilities located throughout 39 countries. Lear is ranked #151 on the Fortune 500. In his position, Mr. Larkin holds responsibility for Lear's Business Development and Legal and Regulatory matters globally. In addition, Mr. Larkin oversees Lear's Internal Audit and Compliance functions.



Mr. Larkin graduated from Michigan State University in 1976 with high honors and a Bachelor of Arts in Finance. He received his J.D.

cum laude in 1979 from Wayne State University Law School where he served as an editor of the Wayne Law Review. Upon graduation, Mr. Larkin began a 28-year career with the business law firm based in Detroit, Bodman PLC.

Mr. Larkin was named a partner at Bodman in 1986 and thereafter was appointed as a member of Bodman's Executive Committee, the managing partner of Bodman's office in Troy, Michigan, and chairman of the firm's Business Law Practice Group.

He serves as a member of the board of directors of Kelly Services, Inc., Life Directions and the Detroit Regional Chamber of Commerce. He is also a fellow of the Michigan State Bar Foundation.

2018 Guiding Light Honoree

Jack Aronson is a former restaurateur who, with his wife Annette, founded Garden Fresh Gourmet in Ferndale, Michigan, back in 1998. Having grown it into one of the premier deli supply companies in North America, with over 400 employees, the Aronsons sold Garden Fresh to the Campbell Soup Company in 2015, on the condition that they commit to keeping manufacturing operations in Ferndale and further invest in the local community. Jack remains affiliated with Campbell, serving as technical advisor on many of the company's fresh food initiatives.



In 2016, Jack and Annette founded Clean Planet Foods, which makes clean proteins and other healthy entrées, and whose

mission is to *change the way the world eats—for the better!* Clean Planet Foods currently operates a USDA manufacturing facility in Clinton Township.

Jack serves on the board of Beyond Basics (an organization promoting youth literacy), as well as the national board of the Salvation Army. Through their foundation, he and Annette are significant contributors to Boys and Girls Clubs of South Oakland County, as well as other charitable causes focusing on bettering the lives of children and young adults.

In recent years, Jack's passion for healthy food, combined with his abiding interest in innovative food manufacturing processes, has driven him to become a thought leader in the application of High-Pressure Processing (HPP) to the production of safe, wholesome food products. He remains deeply involved in the emerging food entrepreneur scene in southeast Michigan, and is in the process of constructing Michigan's first HPP tolling facility and food innovation center in Taylor, just southwest of Detroit.

Life Directions[®] staff in partnership with peer leaders provide **three interconnected programs** that network the social capital of adolescents and the adults who support them.

The Peer Motivation Program

operates in the high school bringing achieving students together with at-risk students. The students explore issues they confront, see ways to be responsible for their future, discuss common challenges and consider consequences to actions. Outside the school facility, they connect with the Neighborhood Enrichment Program to organize peacebuilding activities that promote skill enhancing, are diversity driven, and encourage peers to inspire their peers beyond Life Directions.

The Peer Mentor Program

is an intergenerational after school program. Achieving 10th-11th graders from who completed the Peer Motivation Program are recruited and trained as Peer Mentors. After school they mentor 8th graders from a neighboring Middle School to prepare them for a positive transition to High School. The Neighborhood Enrichment Program

inspires young adults ages 18 to 35 and adult volunteers over age 35, to "break the cycle of violence in the community" through peer outreach and organizing intergenerational events with youth involved in the Peer Motivation and Peer Mentor programs. The neighborhood circles formed provide peer to peer support in a value driven manner.

The quality of relationship between ethnically diverse youth and young adults is enriched in school and neighborhood settings through:

- Community Service Learning Projects
- Leadership Training and Summits
- Intergenerational Community Building Gatherings

By leading group interactions and teaching the values they have learned peer leaders develop the necessary soft skills important to be successful in life and work.
