WHAT IS THE §179D TAX DEDUCTION?

This powerful tax incentive rewards architects of government/municipal-owned buildings with a federal tax deduction of *up to \$1.80 per square foot* for their energy-efficient design. This tax deduction will increase annually starting in 2021. The deduction can be used to increase cash flow and limit tax liability.
