




American Indian and Alaska Native Homeownership




Asian Homeownership




Black or African American




Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander

METHODOLOGY NOTES

The data and analytics were provided by Polygon Research via CensusVision, from 2019 1YR American Community Survey (ACS) PUMS, sourced from iPUMS.

Race and ethnicity at the household level are counted by the responses of the householder (the survey respondent). Race categories are "alone" - i.e. where only 1 race value was supplied. Other/2 or More Races represents responses with 2 to 6 races.

We compared the homeownership rate for each minority Race and Ethnicity category to the statewide rate for all homeowners. The resulting gap was the basis of the ranking. The homeownership rate coming closest to (or exceeding) the statewide rate was ranked as 1 (best).

The rankings range from 1 to 51 (50 states plus DC). In the case of Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, the range only extends from 1-46.
