Our programs bring youth from diverse backgrounds together to learn workforce development skills, connect to high-demand career pathways, and empower youth to advocate for themselves and their communities.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Georgia's film industry and related occupations pay an average salary of \$54,082 annually - \$10,000 more than the statewide average for all occupations

Georgia's booming film sector employs over 30,000 people. Yet according to a recent report by the Georgia Department of Labor, few opportunities exist for Georgia youth to learn these skills



re:imagine/ATL's students learn workforce readiness through technical training and develop soft skills like networking and business etiquette

Since 2014, re:imagine/ATL has served over 1,000 youth and created music videos, public service announcements, documentaries, podcasts and more, entirely produced by teens.

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Long-term, after school and summer fellowship to equip students with training, connections, and equipment to take their storytelling to the next level in preparation for college and career placement. COMMUNITY

Short-term, in-school programming to help students serve their communities through design thinking and media production. From identifying an area of discontent, to ideating, prototyping, and executing a proposed solution, students will learn that change starts with individual action.

WORKSHOPS

ACCELERATOR

Short, immersive workshops focus on specific subject areas relevant to film and digital media. Includes Crash Course - weekend workshops, Currents - free weeknight workshop, and Mobile Workshops - brought directly to schools and youth-serving organizations.

CAMP

Green Room music video camp for students to explore writing, producing and editing an original music video in just one week. Students work closely with local professionals, visual artists, and musicians.

PLACEMENT

re:imagine/ATL partners with local organizations to provide internships and job shadowing opportunities in film and digital media.

OPEN STUDIO

re:imagine/ATL works with partners to provide space, equipment and a community for young storytellers to create. Last Thursday of each month from 4-6pm at the Lang Carson Rec Center.
